# How to do a super search

**Many Indigenous and non-Indigenous Australians have more than one super account, which means more than one set of fees.**

- 1** Log in or create a MyGov account – This is where your super information is kept and you can check how many accounts you have, how much you have in super and consolidate your funds. Super information is at the bottom of the ATO page in MyGov.
- 2** See how your fund is performing using the YourSuper Comparison Tool – Not all funds perform equally or charge the same amount of fees. You can check how your fund is performing at [ATO.gov.au/Calculators-and-tools/YourSuper-comparison-tool](https://ATO.gov.au/Calculators-and-tools/YourSuper-comparison-tool)
- 3** Consider combining your accounts – If you have more than one super account, you can consolidate them in MyGov. Just make sure you don't miss out on any insurance benefits by doing so. You can speak to a financial counsellor if you're worried about this or wish to find out more. - 4** Keep your details up to date – Through MyGov, you can make sure all your details are up to date. This includes where you live and your Tax File Number. You can do this by clicking on 'My profile' and 'Personal details' in MyGov.
